Courtesy to Neighbours

Inclosed Lands Protection Act

Just a reminder that our school is Inclosed Land and that there is no access to the school site outside of school hours, unless attending a planned program on the school site. If attending OOSH, karate, church or Chinese sessions at the school, all visitors must stay in the designated areas of the programs hire. Access to individual classrooms and playground areas is not permitted. People who are found to be trespassing on school property may be excluded from the school site, in accordance with the Inclosed Lands Protection Act, for a period of up 12 months.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS

The Department recognises that some families will be subject to family breakdown. In the absence of any notification to the contrary, it will be assumed that both parents retain a shared and equal parental responsibility for their children and have been involved in making any decisions regarding their children's education. ANAPHYLAXIS AND US

As mentioned in previous newsletters we have several children and staff members at our school who are anaphylactic. If you are sending food to school to be shared with other children eg: birthday cakes or cakes for sale, please be very careful to read the ingredients and ensure that they do not contain peanuts, tree nuts and nut products. Some of our children are also allergic to eggs and milk.

Please also send in the packet ingredients so that we can check them for ourselves.

Other ways to support us to keep everyone safe are:

- Talk to your children about allergies and how serious they can be for some people so they must not ever share their food with other children. Its not mean to not share food its keeping people safe.
- Discuss how important it is to wash hands before and after eating so that food allergens don't get transferred onto other people or their food.
