Whole School Student Wellbeing at CPPS

All public schools in NSW are required to have a planned approach to wellbeing that includes the following elements:

- Teaching and learning
- Behaviour, discipline and character education
- Learning and support
- Professional practice
- Effective leadership
- School planning

The reason for this is that all of these elements are not only connected to each other, they also impact on student wellbeing.

Wellbeing is defined broadly as the quality of life a person experiences. As humans, we experience mental, emotional, social, physical and spiritual wellbeing. Mental wellbeing is linked to achievement and success. These experiences are in turn affected by motivation and persistence. Mental wellbeing is a very important factor in student learning.

Emotional wellbeing relates to a student's awareness of themselves and how their behaviour impacts themselves, their learning and others. It includes resilience and is affected by a child's growing capacity for self-reflection. Social wellbeing is linked to feeling connected to others and experiencing positive relationships. It is critical to a child's growing capacity to behave in socially acceptable ways and to develop empathy for others.

Physical wellbeing is connected to feeling physically safe and healthy. It includes good food choices, preventative health care, like immunisation, physical activity, physical safety and security. Physical wellbeing supports good health.

Spiritual wellbeing relates to our sense of meaning and purpose in the world. It can include culture, religion, community, beliefs, values and ethics.

Schools play a vital role, in partnership with families and community organisations, in developing and nurturing these different types of wellbeing in children.

Over the next term I will be outlining for you the ways in which our school currently addresses these different, but related kinds of wellbeing and seeking your input and support for further improving on what we do.



Parking at the front of the school

As many of you will have noticed, the local council has changed the parking arrangements at the front of the school to allow more vehicles access parking spots. While it is not an official kiss and drop zone, I encourage parents to use it in that way, at least before school and at the very end of the school day to prevent stress and conflict over parking.

The intention of a Kiss & Drop zone is that it allows parents to drop children off safely and quickly. To make our kiss and drop zone work effectively and safely please follow these simple ideas.

- Don't park there before 9:30 am (fines can apply),
- Preferably don't park there after 2:30 (this a courtesy request, no fines apply)
- Move to the very end of the zone so that others can pull in behind you safely without queuing up over the pedestrian crossing (queuing over the pedestrian crossing is illegal).
- Make sure children get out of the car on the

side next to the footpath.

Don't double park (also illegal)

- Please use the pedestrian crossing to set a good example for you children if you are parked across the other side of the road.
- Please leave the "Kiss & Drop" zone safely and as soon as your children are out of the car, to enable other drivers access to the zone.
- If the "Kiss & drop" zone is full, or you wish to get out of your car before school or at the end of the day, please park somewhere else.

As I said, ours is not an official Kiss and Drop zone, and the school can't enforce any of these requests, but if we all do our bit to be kind and respectful to each other, our little piece of the world will be a nice place to be.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS

The Department recognises that some families will be subject to family breakdown. ANAPHYLAXIS AND US

As mentioned in previous newsletters we have several children and staff members at our school who are anaphylactic. If you are sending food to school to be shared with other children eg: birthday cakes or cakes for sale, please be very careful to read the ingredients and ensure that they do not contain peanuts, tree nuts and nut products. Some of our children are also allergic to eggs and milk. **Please also send in the packet ingredients so that we can check them for ourselves.**

Other ways to support us to keep everyone safe are:

- Talk to your children about allergies and how serious they can be for some people so they must not ever share their food with other children. Its not mean to not share food its keeping people safe.
- Discuss how important it is to wash hands before and after eating so that food allergens don't get transferred onto other people or their food.

Thank you for working with us to keep our children safe.


