

# Naplan 2018 – CPPS are trialling Naplan Online

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses the literacy and numeracy skills of students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9, in schools across Australia. NAPLAN assesses writing, language conventions, reading and numeracy. NAPLAN results will help you understand how your child is progressing through school.

In 2018 NAPLAN will begin moving from pencil and paper tests to online tests in some states and territories. A small proportion of NSW schools will do NAPLAN Online in 2018. The move to NAPLAN Online means new benefits for your child's school including better assessment and greater student engagement. CPPS is one of the school's trialing Naplan Online.

#### Supporting your child

NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning in school.

Teachers will ensure students are familiar with test formats prior to NAPLAN tests. Today Years 3 & 5 were involved in a practice Naplan Online test to make sure that they will be familiar with the process when the real tests occur in May. The best way to support your child through NAPLAN is to encourage them to do the best they can on the day.

### Withdrawals and exemptions

You can withdraw your child from NAPLAN tests.

Your child may be exempt from NAPLAN

tests if your child has:

- significant disabilities
- a language background other than English, has recently arrived from overseas and has been attending school for less than a year.

Contact your child's school for further information about withdrawals and exemptions.

#### **Understanding NAPLAN reports**

Your child's NAPLAN report will show their results in the key areas of reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy. Reports are produced for all students who participate in NAPLAN, whether paper or online. These will be available about 12 weeks after the test window closes.

#### Disability adjustments

Adjustments are available to students with disability. Adjustments to testing conditions should reflect the normal support a student receives in classroom assessments.

The first step is to discuss possible adjustments with your child's teacher.

#### Friday PBL Assemblies

This year we are going to run our PBL assemblies a little differently. Last week we had a Year 3-6 assembly. This week will be a K-2 assembly. So 3-6 assemblies will run in the odd school weeks of the term and K-2 assemblies will run in the even weeks of the term. This arrangement will allow for more room for parents and students and shorter assemblies.

#### **Road Safety Reminders**

Several near misses of students crossing roads have been reported to me in recent weeks. We do our best to teach young students road safety rules but we need parents to reinforce that message as well. Some students are not wearing helmets as they ride their bikes or scooters and unfortunately, some students have been reported playing chicken with cars on their bikes by riding in the middle of the road on the wrong side of the road.

Students must have a helmet if they ride bikes or scooters to school and must provide safety chains for their bikes and scooters. Please support our efforts to keep the children safe by reinforcing these messages with your child.

# INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS FAMILY LAW ISSUES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND TRAINING

The Department recognises that some families are subject to family breakdown. In meeting its obligations to students and parents, the Department relies on the following principles -

- the education of a child is primarily the responsibility of the child's parents;
- decisions should be made on the basis of ensuring the continued effective and efficient operation of the school;
- generally, it will be assumed that both parents have been involved in any decisions made concerning major long term issues impacting on the school;
- school decisions are based on what is considered to be in the best interests of the child;
- where parents cannot agree between themselves on what is in the child's best interests, it is the role of the court, not the school, to determine those interests;
- the school is not the appropriate place for family disputes to be resolved nor is it appropriate for school staff to resolve such issues;
- decisions should be made in an unbiased manner and as far as reasonably practicable, without favour to either parent;
- the obligations imposed by other legislation, such as the *Privacy and Personal Information*Protection Act 1998 also need to be considered when dealing with family law related issues;
- the continued effective and efficient operation of the school and parents' obligations under the
   Education Act 1990 to ensure their children of compulsory school age attend school or received
   home schooling take precedence over any interests parents may assert they have under the Family
   Law Act 1975.

Parents have a responsibility to advise the school immediately if any changes in family circumstances occur which have the potential to impact on the relationship between the school and the parents and/or students. If court orders are obtained by one or both parents, a copy of the orders should be provided to the school as soon as possible.

In the absence of any notification to the contrary (such as a court order), it will be assumed that both parents retain a shared and equal parental responsibility for their children. This means that the school will recognise that each parent has equal duties, obligations, responsibilities and opportunities in relation to matters involving their children's education at the school.

	Find out the name(s) of your school's Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) coordinator(s) and how they
	plan to administer the Challenge.
	Familiarise yourself with the PRC website. Logon is not required to view the Booklists or read the
	Rules.
	Visit the new <u>Premier's Reading Challenge Support website</u> . It allows you to search for information about the PRC and also <u>contact the PRC team</u> .
E	Set reminders for Challenge opening and closing dates in your and your child's calendar.
	Find out your child's logon details. For public schools, students' logon will be the same one they use to
	access computers and the internet at school.
	Assist your child to borrow books from the school or local library. Listen to your child read and talk
	about the story/ characters/ information. Read to or with your child if she/he is participating in the K-2
	Challenge.
	Help your child to add books to her/his Student Reading Record regularly. Log on and go to: Student
	Reading Records > enter books by ID or Title or Author. To enter a Personal Choice book, select the
	'Add a Choice Book' tab > enter part of the title or author > select 'Search'. If your book appears as an
	option, select 'Add'. If it does not appear, scroll down to the 'Still can't find a book?' section > enter the

	Your child's online Student Reading Record (SRR) must have the required number of books recorded

	to validate the SRR. Only students with a validated SRR are eligible for a certificate.
	In the final weeks of the Challenge, log on regularly to the website to check the status of your
	child's SRR. Contact your child's PRC coordinator if you are concerned your child's SRR has not been
	validated.

### ANAPHYLAXIS AND US

As mentioned in previous newsletters we have several children and staff members at our school who are anaphylactic. If you are sending food to school to be shared with other children eg: birthday cakes or cakes for sale, please be very careful to read the ingredients and ensure that they do not contain peanuts, tree nuts and nut products. Some of our children are also allergic to eggs and milk. Please also send in the packet ingredients so that we can check them for ourselves.

Other ways to support us to keep everyone safe are:

- Talk to your children about allergies and how serious they can be for some people so they must not ever share their food with other children. Its not mean to not share food its keeping people safe.
- Discuss how important it is to wash hands before and after eating so that food allergens don't get transferred onto other people or their food.
