The author visiting Cambridge Park Public School is Samantha Wheeler, who alongside being a frequently award nominated children's author has also worked with farmers and been a science teacher! Her books, which often explore themes of sustainability and the environment include *Smooch & Rose, Wombat Warriors*, and *Turtle Trackers*.

This means that the school will recognise that each parent has equal duties, obligations responsibilities and opportunities in relation to matters involving the school.



Anaphylaxis and Us

As mentioned in previous newsletters we have several children and staff members at our school who are anaphylactic. If you are sending food to school to be shared with other children eg: birthday cakes or cakes for sale, please be very careful to read the ingredients and ensure that they do not contain peanuts, tree nuts and nut products. Some of our children are also allergic to eggs and milk. **Please also send in the packet ingredients so that we can check them for ourselves.** Other ways to support us to keep everyone safe are:

- 1. Talk to your children about allergies and how serious they can be for some people so they must not ever share their food with other children. Its not mean to not share food its keeping people safe.
- Discuss how important it is to wash hands before and after eating so that food allergens don't get transferred onto other people or their food.
