Contacting Your Child's Teacher

There are many very good reasons for parent's to want to be in touch with their child's teacher. However sometimes parent's find it difficult to get hold of teachers because a teacher's day is so full. Parents are welcome to have quick two-minute discussions with teachers before and after school, however these need to be short and to the point about issues that are relatively simple. For example – Jimmy has a bit of a cold and is out of sorts, or there is a change to pick-up routines etc.

The reason for this is that before school, teachers are usually preparing their classes for the day or are in meetings. If you want to discuss an issue in depth you are unlikely to walk away satisfied because the teacher will have his/her mind on the day ahead and won't be able to give you their full attention. The same applies in the afternoon, although we do have a policy of asking all teachers to be outside their classrooms for the first 15 minutes at the end of the day.

We ask that you don't try to speak with teachers once they are in their classes or when they are walking students to class because teachers have a legal duty of care to the supervision of their students and your quick question may distract them from this. If what you want to discuss is highly important ie ; discipline issue or you want to know about how your child is progressing we strongly recommend you make an appointment. That way the teacher has time to prepare for the meeting and to gather the information ahead of time. You are more likely to find the discussions satisfying and informative if you book in a time with the teacher than if you catch a teacher on the fly and he/she answers your inquiry off the top of their heads.

First Aid at School

We have staff are trained to administer first aid at school when children are injured. That training is updated regularly. Having said that please note that we are unable to treat cuts and abrasions with anything other than water, a band-aid and an icepack. This is to prevent the possibility of causing allergic reactions to treatment. We are unable to administer over the counter medications like Panadol. It's not that we don't care, or don't want to do more. It's that legally we are unable to any more than water, band aids and an icepack.

Homework at CPPS

At our school, we believe that homework benefits students by complementing classroom learning, fostering good study habits and providing an opportunity for students to be responsible for their own learning. Homework will be offered to all students in 2019 and we encourage parents to support their children in completing the homework. Teachers will encourage student participation and recognition will be given to those students who regularly participate in the program. If your circumstances are such that you do not want your

child to participate in homework, please provide a written statement to that effect for the classroom teacher.

Anaphylaxis and Us

As mentioned in previous newsletters we have several children and staff members at our school who are anaphylactic. If you are sending food to school to be shared with other children eg: birthday cakes or cakes for sale, please be very careful to read the ingredients and ensure that they do not contain peanuts, tree nuts and nut products. Some of our children are also allergic to eggs and milk.

Please also send in the packet ingredients so that we can check them for ourselves.

Other ways to support us to keep everyone safe are:

1. Talk to your children about allergies and how serious they can be for some people so they must not ever share their food with other children. Its not mean to not share food its keeping people safe.
2. Discuss how important it is to wash hands before and after eating so that food allergens don't get transferred onto other people or their food.

Thank you for working with us to keep our children safe.

Stage 3 have an exciting year ahead with lots of interesting content being taught. We run Math Groups on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Your child may go to a different Stage 3 teacher depending on their ability. We have been running these for 4 years now and have seen the positive growth in students and their understanding of number.

HOMEWORK: Homework will be handed out by class teachers. Homework is meant to support the learning at school. If you feel that homework is too hard, too easy or you are struggling to get your child to complete it, please talk to your teacher.

YEAR 6 SHIRTS: All students have tried on samples of the Year 6 shirt. Notes will be coming home shortly. It is important once the notes come home to complete and send back to the front office, indicating, how many shirts you wish to purchase. Notes need to be back before we can place an order. If you do not wish to purchase a shirt, can you also send the note back indicating this.

EQUIPMENT: Please ensure that your child comes to school each day ready to learn. It is important that they have blue and/or black pens, lead pencil, rubber, ruler and glue. If there are any issues around providing this equipment, please come and see me.

PSSA: The teams running for summer PSSA sports include: Oztag, League Tag, Basketball, Newcombe Ball, T-Ball and Softball. Summer PSSA does require a commitment throughout Term 1 and Term 4. It is important that if your child is selected and commits to a team, that they are able to pay the fee and commit to playing in both Terms. Notes will be coming home shortly.

We understand that parents are extremely busy and often the time to catch teachers before or after school does not match with your work and home commitments. Should you need to clarify anything, to arrange an appointment or just to touch base and say hello, feel free to send us an email anytime. School Star App and the removal of Facebook as our main form of online communication
Important information Kindergarten families and new families to our school.

Some of you may have already tried to download our School Star App, however the app has not allowed you to do so. The reason for this is that our online enrolment and registration system is networked to a main system which incorporates the 2500 Public Schools across NSW. Due to the high demand on the system over the last few days it has taken longer than expected for individual data to be recognised on the system. It is the information on this system which the app retrieves its data from.

Reminder to all families: Important information about communication through our school app School Star and Facebook

As many of you are aware, over the previous year we have gradually been transferring our main form of online communication from Facebook over to our School Star app. Your child's and families safety is always our first and foremost concern. Departmental requirements state that schools must have a public Facebook page which anyone can access at anytime, therefore we feel that posting information which is only relevant to the families of our school raises security concerns.

This year we have commenced utilising the School Star App to replace Facebook as our main form of online communication. Facebook will only be used to promote community events such as playgroup and events which we open to the wider community. Information such as in school event reminders, late excursion arrivals and most other information which we share online that is relevant to our students, teachers and families will be posted directly to the School Star app.

The School Star app is secure and access is only given to individuals whose phone number is registered with our school. Each time we post information you will receive a notification (please ensure you turn this feature on in your phone and allow access from School Star) similar to if you were to receive a notification from Facebook. An additional benefit with the School Star app is that when your child will not be attending school on a particular day you can simply tap the message button at the bottom of the screen and send a notification to the school that your child/ren will not be at school that day, free of any cost to you.

We would like to encourage everyone to download our free School Star app (For registration instructions please see attached note) so that you are sure to be kept updated and allow ease of communication between home and school. Our school is pleased to announce an upgrade to our school communication services and are replacing our current app. The benefits of our new app include greater security for sharing information and promotion of in class activities – as only parents whose phone numbers are registered with the school are permitted to create an account and log in to the free School Star app. This means that any content we post is protected and confined to the school community only.

Keeping parents and the community informed is very important to us, and we will be regularly uploading content to School Star. You will receive up-to-date current information, newsletters and important announcements within minutes of the school releasing the information!

With School Star, you get the following benefits:

- Receive school news immediately, via a Facebook-like news feed.
- Filter your news feed to see just the news that relates to your child.
- Receive important messages from the school through School Star, instead of by SMS.
- Reply or send your own message to the school for free, day or night.
- See images and videos of your child's classroom activities once posted and view the online school calendar

You also,

- have access to a convenient page of "quick links" to let you easily make a payment, view canteen menu and price list, uniform lists, contact the school and much more.
- can translate content in the app into your preferred language.

We are encouraging all parents to download School Star for free on their iPhone or Android device. Installing School Star is easy. Just follow the instructions below to download and install the app.

iPhone users:

4. If asked, enter your Apple ID password.
5. The "INSTALL" button will turn into an indicator that shows the progress of the download.
6. Once the download has finished, tap "OPEN" to launch School Star.

Android users:

1. Open the Play Store on your Android Phone by tapping its icon.
2. Search the Play Store for "MGM School Star", and tap the search result in the list.
3. Tap the button marked "INSTALL".
4. The "INSTALL" button will turn into an indicator that shows the progress of the download.
5. Once the download has finished, tap "OPEN" to launch School Star.

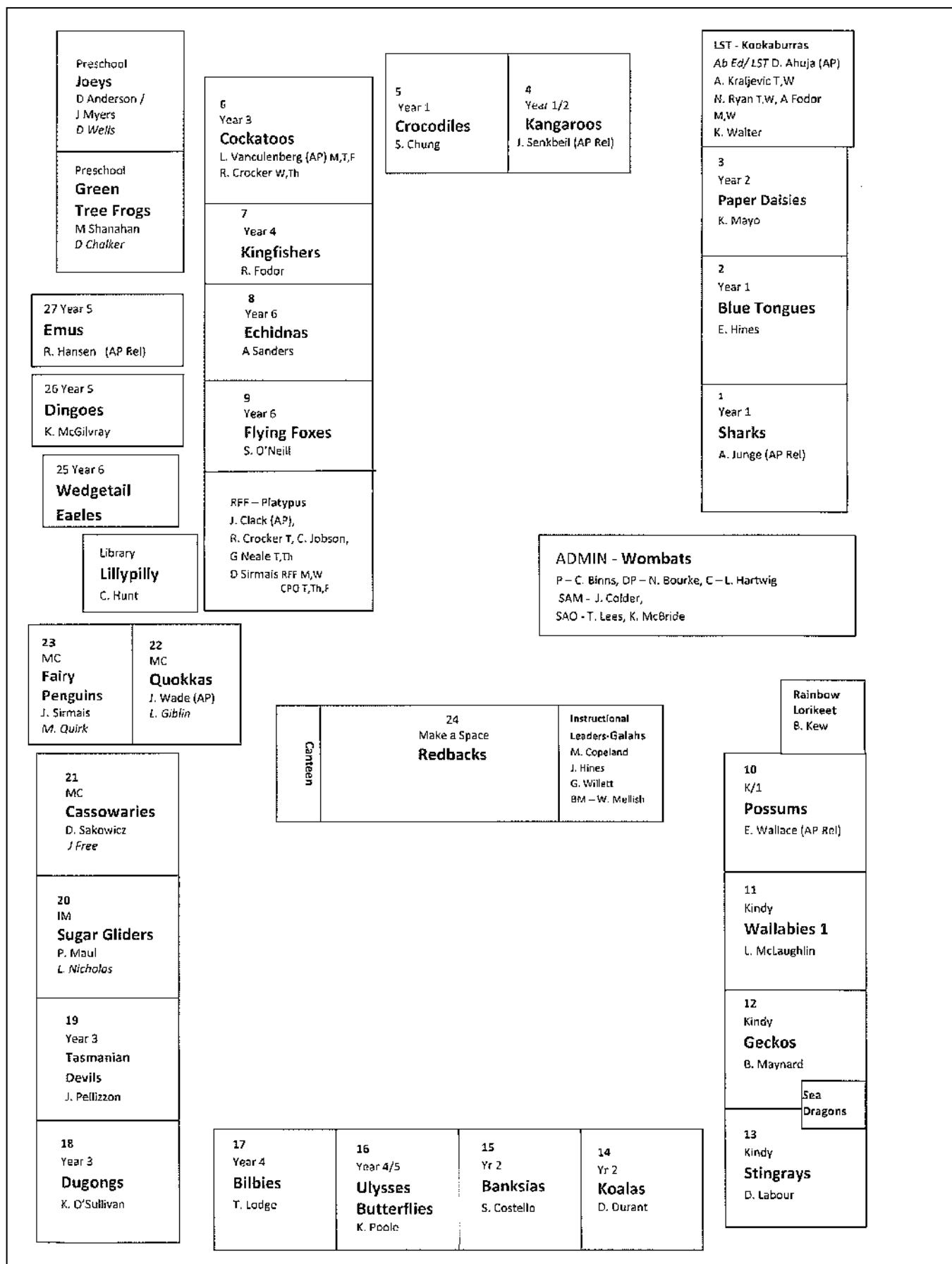
After you register a new account, School Star will automatically detect your school and configure your news feed.

School Opal Card

As part of our campaign against fare evasion, and our on-going commitment to provide the level of service needed to transport students to and from your school, Busways conducts regular checks of School Opal card.

All students must be in possession of a valid Opal card or pay a fare.

Students in possession of an Opal card must also tap on/off with their card when boarding our buses.

This is important, because the Opal data collected determines the level of service we are able to provide to your school. If students don't tap on and off, the services will appear underutilised and may be considered for cancellation based on low passenger numbers.
