

Preschool News

Important information for parents and students

The Department recognises that some families will be subject to family breakdown. Anaphylaxis and Us

As mentioned in previous newsletters we have several children and staff members at our school who are anaphylactic. If you are sending food to school to be shared with other children eg: birthday cakes or cakes for sale, please be very careful to read the ingredients and ensure that they do not contain peanuts, tree nuts and nut products. Some of our children are also allergic to eggs and milk.


Please also send in the packet ingredients so that we can check them for ourselves.

1. Talk to your children about allergies and how serious they can be for some people so they must not ever share their food with other children. Its not mean to not share food its keeping people safe.





Say This, Not That

Say this	Not that

The Power of YET

If your child is feeling frustrated that they can't do something, remind them that they can't do it **YET.**

7 Tips for Promoting a Growth Mindset

1. Remind your child that the brain is a muscle that can be developed and grow.
2. Praise the process. Compliment your child on their hard work, perseverance, and effort.
3. Embrace failures and mistakes. Remind your child that mistakes are part of the learning process. Model how to learn from failure.
4. Understand the role of emotion in learning. Your child might feel frustrated, scared, angry, or even threatened. Learning to process these emotions can help your child embrace challenges instead of running away from them.
5. Help them learn about constructive feedback. Accepting useful feedback can help them learn and grow.
6. Talk about your own mindset and mistakes you've made. Let your child know that they can talk to you about their learning.
7. Celebrate the success of others. Remind your child that there is room for everyone to succeed.
