MESSAGE FROM MISS BERWICK

During Term 3 our school started our journey for school improvement. School improvement is at the heart of the work we do as teachers and school leaders, and needs to 'touch every classroom', be the work of every teacher and impact every student. School improvement is a continuous process, centered on maximising outcomes for all students and sustaining this improvement over time. School improvement is grounded in rigorous self-assessment and analysis of our school's current situation with respect to student outcomes and teaching and leadership practices. When we work towards being a great school that meets the needs of all our students, together we are partnering proactively with others, especially parents, carers and the local community.

Currently our leadership team is completing a situational analysis which is an authentic and rigorous assessment of our school's current state and will be used to inform our school's improvement journey in learning, teaching and leading. Part of the situational analysis is to ensure our students and community have the opportunity to provide their views and feedback. Over the coming term students from P-6, including our support unit will be randomly selected to participate in focus groups to provide their views and feedback.

Community engagement is a critical factor for improving the progress, achievement and wellbeing of our students. When schools, families and the broader community work together to develop positive connections, **students thrive!** Over the coming term and early 2021 we will engage with our community in the development of a shared vision, identify strategic priorities and track progress, as an ongoing practice toward our priorities. Invitations to join focus groups will be shared on DOJO.

I encourage our families to provide feedback via our community survey that was provided via DOJO. If you require the link please contact Mrs. Sirmais.

At Cambridge Park Public School our commitment to establishing genuine and meaningful relationships is exemplified in how we, as a school, relate to and engage with the NSW Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (NSW AECG). Recently our Aboriginal team and I joined our local AECG- Yarramundi for our term 3 meeting. At this meeting I sought advice on creating a Junior AECG to enable our young Aboriginal people to speak and be heard in determining their educational future and feel valued and respected. I look forward to working alongside our AECG to create this opportunity for our community. If you would like to join our Aboriginal team, please message me via DOJO or call our school to talk more.

I truly believe when you genuinely value and engage with your local community, the positive values, attitudes and behaviours for learning are adopted beyond the school's boundaries. Effective in-school strategies for improving outcomes will then be more widely successful when undertaken in partnership with the community. Community engagement in our school will be purposeful, positive and authentic.

We constructed cubic metres using a range of materials that we found, including paper and sticks, to varying degrees of success.


We have learned many skills needed to play basketball and netball.

The Fairy Penguins have been studying The Very Hungry Caterpillar this term. We have had lots of fun creating our very own caterpillars in lots of different ways.
























Anaphylaxis and Us

As mentioned in previous newsletters we have several children and staff members at our school who are anaphylactic. If you are sending food to school to be shared with other children eg: birthday cakes or cakes for sale, please be very careful to read the ingredients and ensure that they do not contain peanuts, tree nuts and nut products. Some of our children are also allergic to eggs and milk. **Please also send in the packet ingredients so that we can check them for ourselves.**

Other ways to support us to keep everyone safe are:

Talk to your children about allergies and how serious they can be for some people so they must not ever share their food with other children. Its not mean to not share food its keeping people safe.
